Examples of How a Balanced Calendar Can Promote *Excellence for Everyone Through Equity*

Help	A balanced calendar can help to reduce summer learning loss , which disproportionately effects our most impacted student populations.	
Provide	A balanced calendar can provide more opportunities for students to receive individualized support and enrichment activities , which can help to narrow the achievement gap. (Timely intervention)	
Reduce	A balanced calendar can reduce stress and anxiety for students and families by providing more breaks throughout the year.	
Address	A balanced calendar can address staff burnout .



Traditional School Calendar

The traditional calendar features a summer vacation of 11 weeks followed by an extended period of instructional days, with the first break coming at Thanksgiving. The winter holidays are followed by 55 instructional days before a short spring break. Spring break is followed by 40 instructional days before the end of the school year




190 days	Teacher Schedule

10 days	Winter Break
5 days	Spring Break
11 weeks	Summer Break

Balanced Calendar

With a balanced calendar, students attend class the same number of days and receive the same instructional hours driven by the same curricula as students at traditional calendar schools.

A balanced calendar modifies the traditional 180-day calendar to keep the learning process continuous. Students have periodic, shorter breaks rather than one long summer break.

All students attend school at the same time and go on vacation at the same time.



190 days	Teacher Schedule

What is a Balanced Calendar?

A BALANCED CALENDAR IS A SCHOOL YEAR
THAT IS DIVIDED INTO MORE FREQUENT,
SHORTER BREAKS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR,
RATHER THAN ONE LONG SUMMER BREAK.
BALANCED CALENDARS CAN TAKE MANY
DIFFERENT FORMS, BUT THEY ALL SHARE
THE GOAL OF REDUCING SUMMER
LEARNING LOSS AND IMPROVING STUDENT
ACHIEVEMENT.

BALANCED CALENDARS HAVE BEEN AROUND FOR OVER 100 YEARS, BUT THEY HAVE BECOME INCREASINGLY POPULAR IN RECENT YEARS. IN THE UNITED STATES, OVER 10% OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS NOW USE A BALANCED CALENDAR.

How is the Academic Calendar Decided?

The academic school calendar is part of the cyclical bargaining agreement with Spokane Education Association (SEA), traditionally on a 3-year cycle. (4-year calendar)

- Operational Implications



Guiding Principle #1: Communication

• **Communication**: A comprehensive communication plan will be implemented to raise awareness about how and why SPS is adopting a balanced calendar, and include intentional and timely outreach to staff, students, families, and the community.

Guiding Principle #2: Instructional Cycle(s)

• Instructional Cycles: SPS values whole child development and will create intentional instructional cycles to promote learning and will use thoughtful breaks to support student and staff well-being.

Guiding Principle #3: Intersessions

 Intersessions: SPS, in partnership with community members and organizations, will explore opportunities to provide intersessions with academic, social/emotional, and extracurricular options.

Guiding Principle #4: Continual Cycle of Improvement

• Continual Cycle of Improvement: SPS commits to address structural barriers that prevent equitable outcomes for students, by using research, data, and community input to inform future actions.

Next Steps...

- 2025-2026: "During the 2023-24 school year, the District and the Association will come together to discuss the 2025-26 school calendar based on the concepts outlined in the current CBA and will be published by February 2025."
- **2026-Beyond**: The District and Association will negotiate future academic calendar years for the 2026-27 school year and beyond as part of large contract negotiations set for next spring and will be inclusive of the principles brought forth by the workgroup.
