- Middle School Matters Rubric
- o Part of PBIS system
- Created by teachers to make tangible the importance of the 3 key indicators of successful students. Attendance/Behavior/Academics
- O How it works: They track grades, GPA, attendance, behavior, binder/planner checks, homebase activity participation, participation in clubs or sports, state district testing participation.
- o 2nd RAD of the year is March 29. Signups for activities happened yesterday.

• Testing (MAP and State): Begins May 7th.

- o 6th and 7th graders take SBA Reading, SBA Writing, and SBA Math (two parts).
- 8th graders take SBA Reading, SBA Writing, SBA Math (two parts), and the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS).
- O Students complete assessments on school laptops, and they leave laptops at school in HB the day before each test.
- Most tests will be completed in Home Base classrooms during a school-wide testing block in the morning.

O Make-up tests will occur from mid-April through late-May.
