## Principal and Staff Presentations

- State testing:
- May $7^{\text {th }}$ start.
- ELA will be a 2 hr . testing block and math testing will be in regular classes.
- $8^{\text {th }}$ grade will take WCAS Science as a block.
- Testing should be wrapped up by May 23. Makeups through May 31.
o Students will charge laptop overnight at school, wired headphones for testing, students encouraged to get good night's rest, eat a good breakfast (breakfast will be served in cafeteria at 840am free of charge), families are encouraged to avoid appts or absences during testing.
o Homeroom will review test taking strategies and practice tests will be done up until test.

- Expo '74 Anniversary Field Trip (7th graders): May $2^{\text {nd }}$
- Busses depart SAC 9:20am
- Students will be in groups of 25. They receive a map of Riverfront Park and visit 8 sites of significance noted on the map. At each site, Gonzaga students will greet the group and share the history of the site.
- $7^{\text {th }}$ grade teachers will accompany students, three or four parent volunteer chaperones will also be welcome. Permission slips will go out in home base next week. Students return around noon in time for their usual lunch.

- CTE-A lot of projects and big work going on.
- ELA-continued to work with feeder pattern teachers on Vertical Alignment. The team is committed to writing grants for books and are leaders in the district for book approval process.
- $7^{\text {th }} / 8^{\text {th }}$ : planning for Rocket Launch, a design and engineering challenge. $6^{\text {th }}$ grade science is working on a plan to join the fun of an end of year engineering project. $7^{\text {th }}$ is headed to Manito Gardens to do field experiments. $8^{\text {th }}$ grade has been prepping all year to take the WCAS which covers 6-8 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ grade content.
- Math-continuing to work on refining the 9-grid, and they have been using MAP data to set big goals with the kids. Seeing incredible growth on MAP tests!
- Social Studies-integrating AP strategies into each of their classes. In $8^{\text {th }}$, this culminates with the CBA that students completed a few months ago.
- Kim Taylor-Teacher of the Month for April-Nominated by Loona Brewster!
- Ava Brattabo-Science Award. Yasuhara Science in Spokane Award, received invitation to compete in Thermo Fisher Scientific Junior Innovators, received an all-expense paid trip to International Science and Engineering Fair in Los Angeles, CA.
- RAD Award-600 kids, 3 on 3 basketball, dance Party, small pot gardening, popcorn and movie, pickleball.
