Double spacing between each line—no more and no less

Use a website like Easybib.com to put the correct information in your entries.

Format your works cited list by following these steps.

- Center the title Works Cited one inch from the top. Double space before the first entry.
- Double-space each entry; also double-space between entries.
- Begin each entry flush with the left margin. If the entry runs more than one line, indent additional lines five spaces.
- List each entry alphabetically by the author's last name. If there is no author, use the first word of the title (disregard A, An, The).
